

How to be a Londoner?

Read the text.

"Planning some time in London but don't want to be mistaken for a tourist? We can help! Six ways to pass for a true Londoner..."

Rule 1: Don't look at people.

This is true - on the street, on the Underground, everywhere you go men and women do not seem to look at each other. In reality they do, but they do it in the English way: discreetly. Everyone hides behind newspapers and books, only looking at others when they won't be noticed.

The sad truth about is that male Londoners, like all English men, are generally not good at seduction. Not good at all. They are like panda bears. For a tourist girl in London, there is a simple rule – if an Englishman is courageous enough to say something to you, anything at all, it is practically a declaration of love.

Rule 2: Dress like you're in Ibiza.

The English summer is wild. Sometimes it is lovely, but often it is simply absent. Foreigners find this depressing, but Londoners take a more positive approach to the situation – if it is not actively raining, they will dress like they are in Ibiza.

For girls, this means going out on a Saturday night in short skirts and strappy tops. The temperature is not important. Seriously, they even do this in December. They have antifreeze in their veins.

As such, it is always easy to detect the tourist because only tourists dress according to the weather. On cold day in July, for example, a tourist might put on a coat.

Yes, it is illogical and ridiculous. But there is a good side to this: in London, you are free to wear anything. All styles are acceptable, from designer chic to street fashion, nobody will judge you. So be free. Have fun. But be warned: you will probably never wear most of the clothes you bought in London when you are back home...

Rule 3: Be positive about the weather.

This is the logical extension of Rule 2. It's no good dressing like we live in Ibiza and then complaining about the weather, is it?

Imagine there is torrential rain. Londoners will just say "It's a little bit wet, isn't it?" in an amused manner. Philosophically, this is a good attitude – what is the point of complaining about bad weather, after all? It won't change it!

Rule 4: Everything is a joke.

Jokes and ironic comments are the city's essential form of communication. This is a positive thing, but it's also defensive because it is really just a way to avoid emotion. Emotions are embarrassing.

Londoners demonstrate friendship by making fun of each other. It's perverse, but insults are in fact a sign of affection, especially among men. So if someone makes a bad joke about the French, for example, he is probably just trying to be friendly to you – the best reaction is to laugh and make a bad joke about the English in return.

The worst thing you can do is to give the impression that you take yourself too seriously. Laugh at yourself, and with those around you, and you are well on the way to being accepted as a true Londoner.

Rule 5: Don't jump the queue.

This is what Londoners take most seriously. In a busy, overpopulated city such as London, queue are sacred – someone who pushes to the front of a queue is considered as a barbarian. That sort of thing may be acceptable in the jungle but not here. This is London, not the Hunger Games!

And be careful: even when you can't see a queue, there is always a queue. Always. Everyone there will know whose turn is next – and when it is yours.

Rule 6: Apologize. Even if it's not your fault.

Some people find it difficult to apologize, even when they know they are at fault. Not Londoners. Imagine you are walking down the street and, because you're not looking where you're going you bump into a Londoner coming the other way. The Londoner will immediately apologize, even if it was your fault. You have to apologize too – even if you think it's his fault. If you don't, it's obvious you're a tourist.
